comprehending cults second edition provides a sociological interpretation of the phenomenon of new religious movements while the author does not offer an apologia for cults in either a religious or a sociological sense he does attempt to replace suspicion and misinformation with a greater knowledge of the facts as best we know them and a measure of sympathetic understanding completely revised and updated in this second edition the book examines all aspects of cults while striving to delineate the very real limits of our knowledge in addition to dealing with the troublesome aspects of the subject including issues of violence sexuality and brainwashing the author also considers the possibility that new religious movements are a source of spiritual satisfaction to their members offering up to date social science research about contemporary religious cults comprehending cults second edition is ideal for undergraduate sociology of religion and new religious movements courses

an original collection of primary documents conveying the wide array of ideas connected to new religious movements new religious movements is a highly unique volume bringing together primary documents conveying the words and ideas of a wide array of new religious movements nrms and offering a first hand look into their belief systems arranged by the editors according to a new typology the text allows readers to consider nrms along five interrelated pathways from those that offer new perceptions of existence or new personal identities to those that center on relationships within family like units to those movements that highlight the need for recasting the social order or anticipate the dawn of a new age the volume includes original documents from groups such as the unification church theosophy branch davidians wicca jehovah s witnesses santeria and seventh day adventists as well as many others each section is prefaced by a contextual introduction and concludes with a list of sources for further reading new religious movements offers a rare inside look into the worldviews of alternative religious traditions

what is a cult why do they emerge who joins them and why do tragedies such as waco and jonestown occur this reader brings together the voices of historians sociologists and psychologists of religion to address these key questions about new religious movements looks at theoretical explanations for cults why people join and what happens when they do brings together the best work on cults by sociologists historians and psychologists of religion a broad ranging balanced and clearly organized collection of readings includes coverage of topical issues such as the brainwashing controversy and cults in cyberspace section introductions by the editor situate the nature value and relevance of the selected readings in context of current discussions

this text explores the major new or unconventional religions and spiritual movements in america that exist outside the judeo christian tradition

this explores the question of when and why violence by and against new religious cults erupts and whether and how such dramatic conflicts can be foreseen managed and averted the authors leading international experts on religious movements and violent behavior focus on the four major episodes of cult violence during the last decade the tragic conflagration that engulfed the branch davidians in waco texas the deadly sarin gas attack by the aum shinrikyo in tokyo the murder suicides by the solar temple in switzerland and canada and the collective suicide by the members of heaven's gate they explore the dynamics leading to these dramatic episodes in north america europe and asia and offer insights into the general relationship between violence and religious cults in contemporary society the authors conclude that these events usually involve some combination of internal and external dynamics through which a new religious movement and society become polarized

this prestigious companion offers the most comprehensive survey todate of the study of religion featuring a team of international contributors and edited by one of the most widely respected scholars in the field the blackwell companion to the study of religion provides an interdisciplinary and authoritative guideto the subject examines the main approaches to the study of religion anthropology the comparative method economics literature philosophy psychology sociology and theology also covers a diverse range of topical issues such as the body fundamentalism magic and new religious movements consists of 24 essays written by an outstanding team of international scholars reviews within each chapter an outline of a particular subfield and traces its development up to the present day debates how the discipline may look in the future represents all the major issues methods and positions in the field

in the face of the increasingly variegated ideological landscape of contemporary america cults have become the focus of public controversy the growth of new religions has been matched by the development of an organized and vocal opposition the anti cult movement this in turn has prompted an extensive investigation of new religious movements nrms by sociologists and psychologists of religion as well as historians and religious studies scholars the readings collected here contribute to the debate about cults by sampling some of the best and most accessible publications from the academic study of nrms the contributors address the questions most commonly asked about cults such as what brought about the emergence of new religious movements what is a cult or new religious movement who joins new religious movements and why are converts to new religious movements brainwashed why did the jonestown and waco tragedies happen are cults inclined to be violent what does the emergence of so many new religious movements say about our society what does it say about the future of religion cults in context surveys the descriptive typologies theories and data accumulated by sociologists and psychologists studying new religious movements over the last twenty years it serves to defuse many popular fears and misconceptions about cults allowing the reader to develop a more reasonable and tolerant understanding of the people who join new religious movements and the functions of these movements in contemporary society

misunderstanding cults provides a uniquely balanced contribution to what has become a highly polarized area of study working towards a

moderate third path in the heated debate over new religious movements or cults this collection includes contributions from both scholars who have been characterized as anticult and those characterized as cult apologists the study incorporates multiple viewpoints as well as a variety of theoretical and methodological perspectives with the stated goal of depolarizing the discussion over alternative religious movements a prominent section within the book focuses explicitly on the issue of scholarly objectivity and the danger of partisanship in the study of cults the collection also includes contributions on the controversial and much misunderstood topic of brainwashing as well as discussions of cult violence children brought up in unconventional religious movements and the conflicts between alternative religious movements and their critics unique in its breadth this is the first study of new religious movements to address the main points of controversy within the field while attempting to find a middle ground between opposing camps of scholarship

the study of new religious movements nrms is one of the fastest growing areas of religious studies and since the release of the first edition of the oxford handbook of new religious movements in 2003 the field has continued to expand and break new ground in this all new volume james r lewis and inga b t llefsen bring together established and rising scholars to address an expanded range of topics covering traditional religious studies topics such as scripture charisma and ritual while also applying new theoretical approaches to nrm topics other chapters cover understudied topics in the field such as the developmental patterns of nrms and subcultural considerations in the study of nrms the first part of this book examines nrms from a social scientific perspective particularly that of sociology in the second section the primary factors that have put the study of nrms on the map controversy and conflict are considered the third section investigates common themes within the field of nrms while the fourth examines the approaches that religious studies researchers have taken to nrms as nrm studies has grown subfields such as esotericism new age studies and neo pagan studies have grown as distinct and individual areas of study and the final section of the book investigates these emergent fields

scientology s long and complex journey to recognition as a religion scientology is one of the wealthiest and most powerful new religions to emerge in the past century to its detractors I ron hubbard s space age mysticism is a moneymaking scam and sinister brainwashing cult but to its adherents it is humanity s brightest hope few religious movements have been subject to public scrutiny like scientology yet much of what is written about the church is sensationalist and inaccurate here for the first time is the story of scientology s protracted and turbulent journey to recognition as a religion in the postwar american landscape hugh urban tells the real story of scientology from its cold war era beginnings in the 1950s to its prominence today as the religion of hollywood s celebrity elite urban paints a vivid portrait of hubbard the enigmatic founder who once commanded his own private fleet and an intelligence apparatus rivaling that of the u s government one fbi agent described him as a mental case but to his followers he is the man who solved the riddle of the human mind urban details scientology s decades long war with the irs which ended with the church winning tax exempt status as a religion the rancorous cult wars of the 1970s and 1980s as well as the latest challenges confronting scientology from attacks by the internet group anonymous to the church s efforts to suppress the online dissemination of its esoteric teachings the church of scientology demonstrates how scientology has reflected the broader anxieties and obsessions of postwar america and

raises profound questions about how religion is defined and who gets to define it

religion online provides an accessible and comprehensive introduction to this burgeoning new religious reality from cyberpilgrimages to neo pagan chatroom communities a substantial introduction by the editors presenting the main themes and issues is followed by sixteen chapters addressing core issues of concern such as youth religion and the internet new religious movements and recruitment propaganda and the countercult and religious tradition and innovation

contradictory to its core the sitcom an ostensibly conservative tranquilizing genre has a long track record in the united states of tackling controversial subjects with a fearlessness not often found in other types of programming but the sitcom also conceals as much as it reveals masking the rationale for socially deviant or deleterious behavior behind figures of ridicule whose motives are rarely disclosed fully over the course of a thirty minute episode examining a broad range of network and cable to shows across the history of the medium from classic working class comedies such as the honeymooners all in the family and roseanne to several contemporary cult series animated programs and online hits that have yet to attract much scholarly attention this book explores the ways in which social imaginaries related to bad behavior have been humorously exploited over the years the repeated appearance of socially wayward figures on the small screen from raging alcoholics to brainwashed cult members to actual monsters who are merely exaggerated versions of our own inner demons has the dual effect of reducing complex individuals to recognizable types while neutralizing the presumed threats that they pose such representations not only provide strangely comforting reminders that badness is a cultural construct but also prompt audiences to reflect on their own unspoken proclivities for antisocial behavior if only in passing

the 1993 government assault on the branch davidian compound near waco texas resulted in the deaths of four federal agents and eighty branch davidians including seventeen children whether these tragic deaths could have been avoided is still debatable but what seems clear is that the events in texas have broad implications for religious freedom in america james tabor and eugene gallagher s bold examination of the waco story offers the first balanced account of the siege they try to understand what really happened in waco what brought the branch davidians to mount carmel why did the government attack how did the media affect events the authors address the accusations of illegal weapons possession strange sexual practices and child abuse that were made against david koresh and his followers without attempting to excuse such actions they point out that the public has not heard the complete story and that many media reports were distorted the authors have carefully studied the davidian movement analyzing the theology and biblical interpretation that were so central to the group s functioning they also consider how two decades of intense activity against so called cults have influenced public perceptions of unorthodox religions in exploring our fear of unconventional religious groups and how such fear curtails our ability to tolerate religious differences why waco is an unsettling wake up call using the events at mount carmel as a cautionary tale the authors challenge all americans including government officials and media representatives to closely examine our national commitment to religious freedom the 1993 government assault on the branch davidian compound near waco texas resulted in the deaths

of four federal agents and eighty branch davidians including seventeen children whether these tragic deaths could have been avoided is still debatable

discussions of any religion can easily raise passions but arguments tend to become even more heated when the religion under discussion is characterized as new divisions around the study of new religious movements nrms or cults or nontraditional or alternative or emergent religions are so acute that there is even controversy over what to call them john saliba strives to bring balance to these discussions by offering perspectives on new religions from different academic perspectives history psychology sociology law theology and counseling this approach provides rich descriptions of a broad range of movements while demonstrating how the differing aims of the disciplines can create much of the controversy around nrms the new second edition has been updated and revised throughout and includes a new foreword by noted historian of religion j gordon melton for classes in religion or the social sciences or for interested individuals understanding new religious movements offers the most objective introduction possible

jesus promise that the end draws near has spawned an expectation of that grand event across various religious groups this volume examines the abiding social issues that surround the continued presence of apocalyptic anticipation by setting them in historical present day and future manifestations approaching this fervent expectation from a broad perspective gribben and newport explore the contemporary movements with insightful analysis that provokes discussion and even self reflection

rationale and workings of the various approaches moreover each is divided into sub sections dealing with various forms of each approach so that each may be appreciated in its individuality i e the chapter on inclusivism will include sections on fulfilment theology anonymous christians etc the second part of this textbook deals with attitudes towards different faiths considering the problems and relations that exist with christian approaches to each it will deal with the world s major faiths as well as primal religions and new religious movements the introduction and conclusion will deal with some central themes that run throughout in particular the questions of the trinity and concepts of salvation in each section reference will be made to the key texts discussed in the reader which accompanies this 9780334041155 however the work may be read as a stand alone text

for readers of fantasyland and cultish a colorful and enlightening pop history that explains why the eccentric doomsday beliefs of our puritan founders are still driving american culture today contextualizes the current rise in far right extremism as a natural result of our latent indoctrination and proposes that the united states is the largest cult of all since the mayflower sidled up to plymouth rock cult ideology has been ingrained in the dna of the united states in this eye opening book journalist jane borden argues that puritan doomsday belief never went away it went secular and became american culture from our fascination with cowboys and superheroes to our allegiance to influencers and self help susceptibility to advertising and undying devotion to the self made man americans remain particularly vulnerable to a specific brand of cult like thinking with in depth research and compelling insight borden uncovers the american history you didn t learn in school including how we are still being brainwashed making us a nation of easy marks for con artists and strong men along the way she also revisits some of the most fascinating cults in this country including the mankind united and love has won presenting them as integral parts of our national psyche rather than aberrations

new religious movements the basics is a concise and engaging introduction to the field of new religious movements nrms western culture is currently going through a wave of fascination with cults with numerous documentaries and television series dedicated to describing these groups

meanwhile scholars have been wrestling with the intricacies of this loaded category for decades introducing the reader to some of the key issues and debates in the field of nrm studies this book includes discussions on how to define the term new religious movement critically unpacking the term cult how to study nrms brainwashing and deprogramming prophecy and failed prophecy charisma and authority nrms and violence gender and sexuality this book is essential reading for students and scholars of religion who are approaching the study of nrms for the first time as well as those interested in deepening their understanding of nrms

the red brigades were a far left terrorist group in italy formed in 1970 and active all through the 1980s infamous around the world for a campaign of assassinations kidnappings and bank robberies intended as a concentrated strike against the heart of the state the red brigades most notorious crime was the kidnapping and murder of italy s former prime minister aldo moro in 1978 in the late 1990s a new group of violent anticapitalist terrorists revived the name red brigades and killed a number of professors and government officials like their german counterparts in the baader meinhof group and today s violent political and religious extremists the red brigades and their actions raise a host of questions about the motivations ideologies and mind sets of people who commit horrific acts of violence in the name of a utopia in the first english edition of a book that has won critical acclaim and major prizes in italy alessandro or sini contends that the dominant logic of the red brigades was essentially eschatological focused on purifying a corrupt world through violence only through revolutionary terror brigadists believed could humanity be saved from the putrefying effects of capitalism and imperialism through a careful study of all existing documentation produced by the red brigades and of all existing scholarship on the red brigades or sini reconstructs a worldview that can be as seductive as it is horrifying or sini has devised a micro sociological theory that allows him to reconstruct the group dynamics leading to political homicide in extreme left and neonazi terrorist groups this subversive revolutionary feedback theory states that the willingness to mete out and suffer death depends in the last analysis on how far the terrorist has been incorporated into the revolutionary sect or sini makes clear that this political religious concept of historical development is central to understanding all such self styled purifiers of the world from thomas muntzer's theocratic dream to pol pot s cambodian revolution all the violent purifiers of the world have a clear goal to build a perfect society in which there will no longer be any sin and unhappiness and in which no opposition can be allowed to upset the universal harmony orsini s book reconstructs the origins and evolution of a revolutionary tradition brought into our own times by the red brigades

the routledge companion to religion and film brings together a lively and experienced team of contributors to investigate the ways in which this exciting discipline is developing

most sociology of religion texts are decidedly staid and uninteresting covering contemporary developments which are only contemporary only from a disciplinary perspective they are not contemporary if viewed from the perspective of the religion s practioners in religious and non religious settings the textbooks that attempt to be interesting to undergraduate students often fall short because they either try to cover too much in an encyclopedic format or sacrifice a sociological perspective for a personal one many use real life examples only superficially to illustrate concepts lundskow s approach is the opposite students will learn the facts of religion in its great diversity all the most interesting and compelling beliefs and practices and then learn relevant concepts that can be used to explain empirical observations the book thus follows the logic of actual research investigate and then analyze rather than approaching concepts with no real bearing on how religion is experienced in society this approach using provocative examples and with an eye toward the historical and theoretical not to mention global experience of religion will make this book a success in the classroom the author envisions a substantive approach that examines religion as it actually exists in all its forms including belief ritual daily living identity institutions social movements social control and social change within these broad categories the book will devote particular chapters to important historical moments and movements leaders and various individual religions that have shaped the contemporary form and effect of religion in the world today
